Summer 2019 - March 2020 Awareness and Education				
January - November 2019	Census Bureau opens > 200 area census offices.	Start awareness and education campaigns: Tell your community about the census and why participation is important! Share information about 2020 Census job opportunities with your communities and help people apply.  Connect with a community organization in your area to get the word out for the 2020 Census.		
September 2019 onward	Census Bureau recruits and hires temporary Census field staff.	Continue awareness and education campaigns. Continue sharing job opportunities and providing assistance with job applications.		
January 2020	Enumeration starts in Alaska.	Continue awareness and education campaigns:  Share GOTC messaging and factsheets. Contact media and post social media. Plan and host outreach events. Plan canvassing. Explain how the census works and how people can respond.  Plan your on-the-ground outreach and canvassing for the next phase of GOTC starting in March – getting people to respond to the census.		

March - May 2020 People Respond to the Census				
March 9, 2020	Census Questionnaire Assistance toll-free phone lines open.  Phone support is offered in English and 12 non-English languages including Chinese (Mandarin and Cantonese), Japanese, Korean, Tagalog, and Vietnamese.	Continue awareness and education campaigns and share information about the Census Questionnaire Assistance toll-free phone lines which are now open.		
March 12 - 20, 2020	Census Bureau mails materials to all households with information about how to respond online (including unique household ID) and language assistance resources. The online response platform will be live at the time of the first mailing. The Census Bureau also mails the paper form to the 20 percent of households it suspects have the lowest level of internet access.	Motivate people to respond to the census:              Talk to your communities about the census.             Share flyers and factsheets.             Continue media and social media campaigns.		
March 16 -24, 2020	Census Bureau will send a reminder letter to households that have not responded.	Give people the information and support they need to respond:  Host virtual outreach events.  Provide opportunities for people to get help responding to the census.  Continue media and social media campaigns.  Continue canvassing hard-to-count areas through phone-banking, texting, and other activities that keep COVID-19 pandemic health and safety guidelines in mind.  Tip: If someone does not know their unique ID for responding online, they can still submit via the		
March 26 - April 3, 2020	Census Bureau will send a reminder postcard to households that have not responded.			
April 1, 2020	This is the official 2020 Census Day!			
April 8 - 16, 2020	Census Bureau will send a reminder letter and a paper form.			
April 20 - 27, 2020	Census Bureau will send a reminder postcard.			
July 22-28, 2020	Census Bureau will send a reminder postcard. Their outreach to motivate people to self-respond concludes on August 11, 2020 and they begin their non-response follow-up operations afterwards. Households can still self-respond during that time.	Census Bureau's website by giving their address.		

August - October 2020 Reminder and Non-Response Follow-up Phase				
August - October 2020	The Census Bureau sends census workers to visit households that did not return their forms.	Encourage people to respond to the census if they have not yet. <u>They can still respond during this</u> time online, by phone, or by mailing back the paper form.		
	The online form and Census Questionnaire Assistance line are still available for people to respond.	Answer questions community members have about the census and alleviate fears about why census workers may be visiting their households if they have not responded.		
	Post-Census-Taking	g Phase		
September - December 2020	Post-Enumeration Survey to measure coverage error (people missed in count or counted more than once) in the 2020 Census.			
** The Census Bureau had previously requested a pushback in this deadline and Congress can still take action to extend this deadline.	Deadline for Census Bureau to report state population totals to the President for apportionment purposes.
